As we start having cooler weather, it is time to start thinking about winter. Here are some basic procedures for snow removal. Anytime snow is predicted, Concord Apartment residents need to move their cars to the top (North side) of the lot so that the snow can be cleaned up along the sidewalks and parking spaces. When that is complete, cars can be moved back. Snow removal will begin when accumulation has reached 2" or a storm is done. Please be patient and wait for snow to be removed and ice melter put down. If condo residents have an appointment and need to get out, please let us know so that we can make sure your drive is cleared in time. If anyone has questions about the roads, please call the office before venturing out. Always be safe.

For your safety and your neighbors, please let us know in the office if you plan to be away from the community for more than 24hrs. When we know you are away from your home, we can keep an eye on things and in the event of an emergency; we would not be putting emergency personnel or anyone else in harm's way searching for you.

Please be mindful of the 15 MPH speed limit here on the Vineyard Campus and remind any visitors you have of the speed limit as well. Safety is important to all.

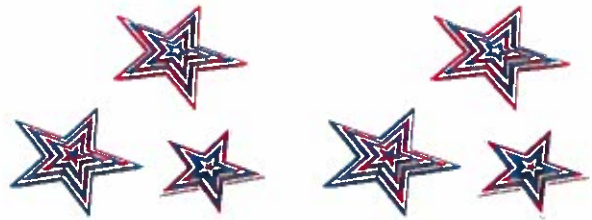
### Technical Support

### ***Mama Mia! Here We Go Again***

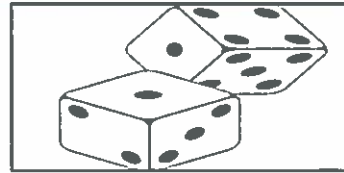
(newly released on DVD; starring Meryl Streep; rated PG-13; 1 hr, 54 mins)

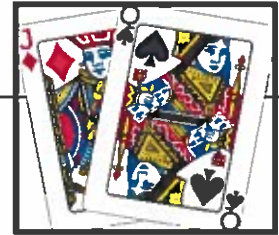

### Before you make a memorial gift, consider this:

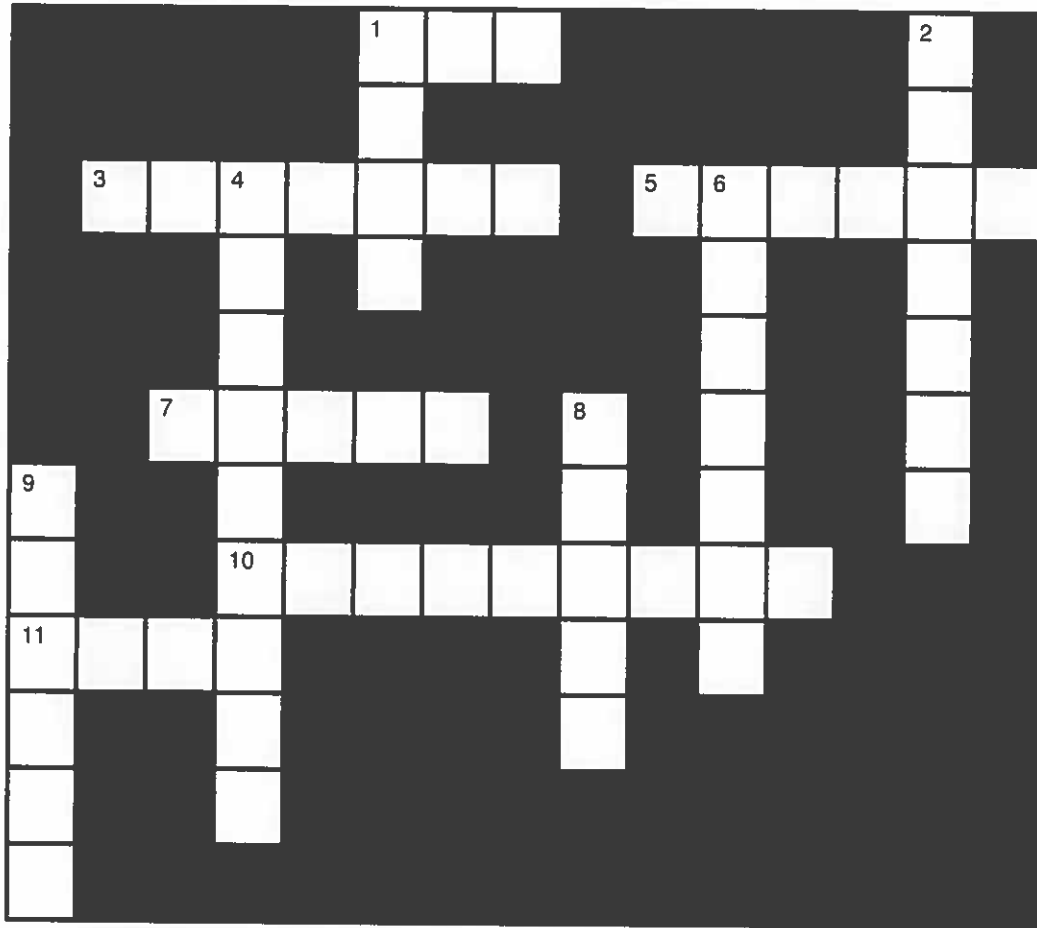

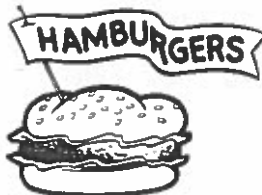

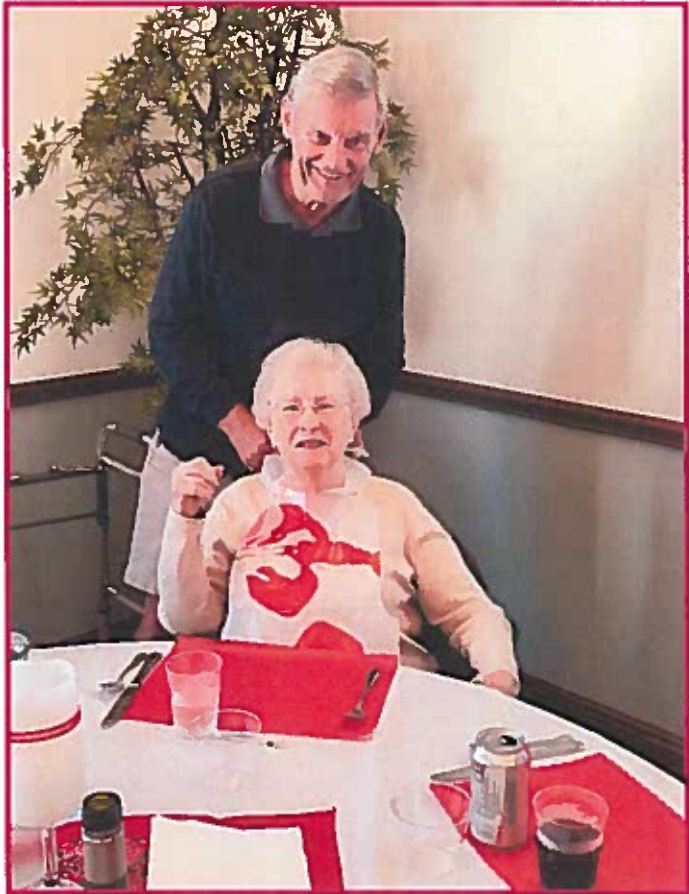

# Recipe of the Month for November 2018



*A little bird told me that this was a big hit at the Oktoberfest Cookbook Dinner!*

## Ruthie Kimmett's

### Slow-Cooker Country Style Ribs and Sauerkraut

**2 lb. Boneless Pork Country Style Ribs,  
cut in 2" chunks and lightly salted.**

**2 lb. Sauerkraut (cans or package).**

**2 cans Chicken Broth**

**1 medium potato, peeled and diced small.**

**(\*Per Ruthie this helps to take some of the bite out of the sauerkraut!)**

**Add: Chopped Onion *to taste*.**

**1 Tbsp. Brown Sugar**

**1 tsp. Caraway Seed**

**Add: Pepper *to taste*.**

**Brown the ribs in a small amount of oil in a frying pan.**

**While they are browning, rinse the sauerkraut and let drain.**

**Pour 1 can of chicken broth into slow-cooker and start on HIGH setting.**

**When the ribs are well browned, remove with slotted spoon and add to slow-cooker.**

**Add the kraut, potatoes, onion, seasoning, and the last can of chicken broth to the slow-cooker.**

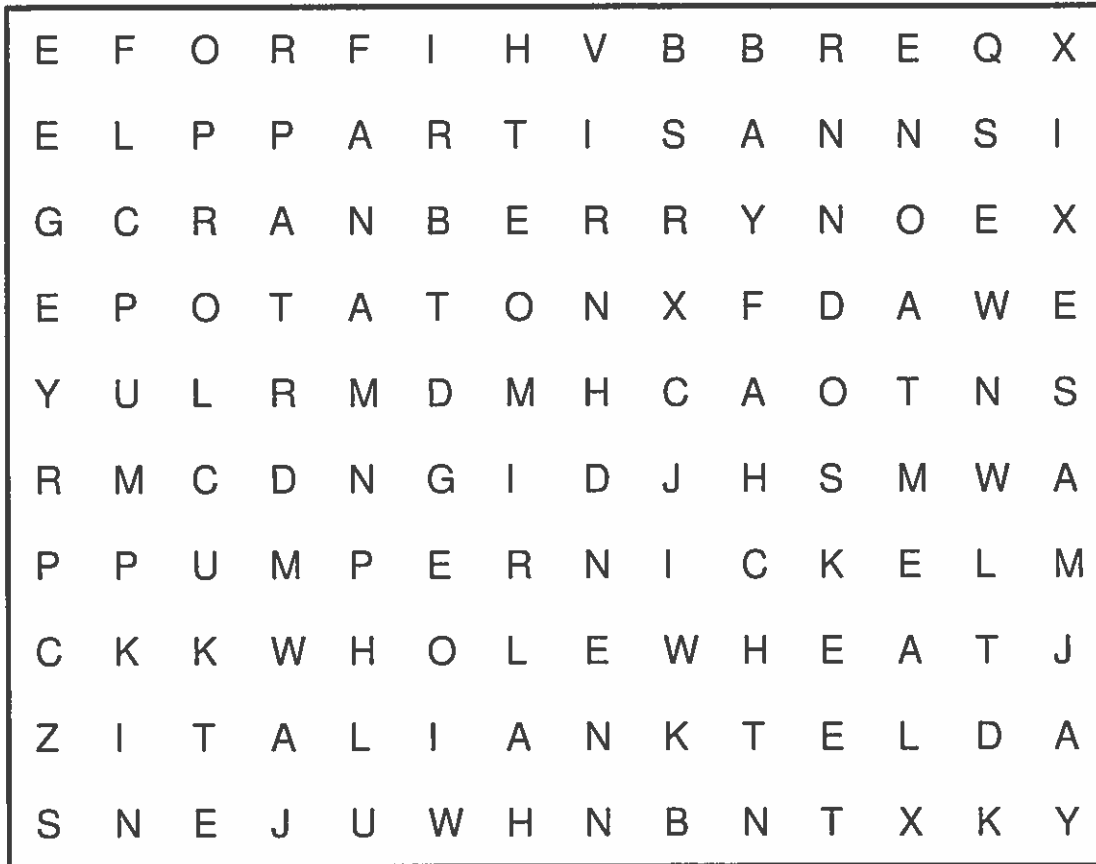
**Cook on High for 1 – 2 hours; then turn to LOW for about 6 more hours.**

***Ruthie's recommendation: Serve with mashed potatoes and gravy (made from a package) for a delicious winter meal!***

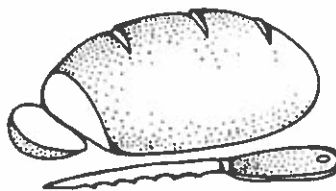
